SUMMER SAVINGS TIPS



ONLY WATER WHEN NEEDED. Depending on the type of plants or turf, you may only need to water once or twice a week. Avoid planting shade loving plants in sun as it will require more water to live.

TIMING IS EVERYTHING. Plan to water in the early morning or evening to reduce water evaporation. Watch the weather reports to avoid watering when rain is in the forecast.

WATCH WHAT YOU'RE WATERING. Make sure your sprinklers are not wasting water on paved areas or shaded areas where less water is needed.

SWEEP, DON'T SPARY. Use a broom instead of a hose to clean patios, decks & sidewalks.

WASH VEHICLES WISELY. Don't leave the water hose running while washing your car at home. Attach an automatic shut-off nozzle to your hose.

TUNE UP YOUR IRRIGATION SYSTEM. Inspect irrigation systems for leaks and broken or clogged sprinkler heads.

COVER YOUR POOL. Using a pool cover will help reduce water evaporation. This will also save money on chemicals and heating costs.

SEWER IMPROVEMENTS FOR MYNATT AND RIFLE RANGE ROAD AREA

This sewer improvement project consists of the rehabilitation/replacement of approximately 14,000 linear feet of sewer main and the rehabilitation/replacement of all manholes and sewer services on these sewer mains.
