THE PREVIOUS MINUTES OF THE MARCH 10, 2025, MEETING WERE APPROVED ON A MOTION BY MR. COOK, SECOND BY MS. BARGER. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

MR. CARDWELL RECOGNIZED HPUD CUSTOMER, MICKEY WORMSLEY. MR. WORMSLEY INQUIRED REGARDING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN HPUD COMMISSIONER (TERM EXPIRATION AND LIMITS, HOW TO APPLY, HOW COMMISSIONERS ARE APPOINTED, ETC...) HE ALSO REQUESTED INFORMATION REGARDING THE DISTRICT'S RATE STRUCTURE. MR. CARDWELL PROVIDED INFORMATION REGARDING BOTH INQUIRIES, AND THEN OFFERED TO MEET WITH MR. THE BOARD APPROVED THE PAY REQUESTS, UPON RECOMMENDATION BY THE CONSULTING ENGINEERS, ON A MOTION BY MR. COOK, SECOND BY MS. BARGER. THE MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

MR. FREAR PRESENTED A REPORT ON THE CMOM PROGRAM (CAPACITY, MANAGEMENT, OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE) RELATED TO THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM, ALONG WITH AN UPDATE ON THE STATUS OF WORK COMPLETED REGARDING THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND CONSERVATION (TDEC) CONSENT ORDERS. HE UPDATED THE BOARD ON IMPROVEMENTS THAT HAVE BEEN MADE SINCE 2006, WHEN THE FIRST CONSENT ORDER WAS ISSUED:

GRAVITY SEWER:

•	Replaced	73,106 LF
•	Rehabilitated	344,236 LF
•	Inspected	3,071,283 LF
•	Cleaned	705,801 LF

MANHOLES:

•	Replaced	269
•	Rehabilitated	2,065
•	Inspected	12,128

MR. FREAR REPORTED THE DAILY AVERAGE PLANT FLOWS ARE 6.5 MGD. HE ALSO REPORTED THAT TWO SEWER REHABILITATION PROJECTS TO TARGET WET WEATHER SSO'S (SANITARY SEWER OVERFLOW) HAVE BEEN COMPLETED. THESE PROJECTS WERE MYNATT RD/RIFLE RANGE RD AND THE NORTHFIELD AREA IN POWELL. WET WEATHER SSO'S HAVE BEEN SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCED TO AN AVERAGE OF LESS THAN 20 IN THE PAST TWO YEARS, FROM AN AVERAGE OF 92 OVER THE PAST TEN YEARS. THERE HAVE BEEN ZERO CHRONIC SSO'S IN THE PAST TWO YEARS, AND THE MANAGEMENT TEAM CONTINUES TO MONITOR AREAS WITH PREVIOUS CHRONIC OVERFLOWS. THE SYSTEM WILL CONTINUE TO BE EVALUATED, AND FUTURE SEWER REHABILITATION PROJECTS WILL BE PRIORITIZED.

THE DISTRICT WAS PRESENTED WITH THE "2024 OUTSTANDING OVERFLOW ABATEMENT AWARD" BY THE KENTUCKY & TENNESSEE CLEAN WATER PROFESSIONALS.
