#### Water Wise or Water Waste?

Grade Levels: K-3<sup>rd</sup> grade

Time: 30 minutes

# **Activity**

This activity allows students to compare ways they use water and determine if they waste or conserve water.

## **Objective**

Classify ideas into categories. Identify practices that waste or conserve water.

### **Materials**

Sorting page and activity cards

Scissors

Glue (optional)

### Procedure

- 1. Whole group: Discuss with students how they use water each day.
- 2. Focusing on 1-2 answers, ask students how the activity can be done without wasting water and how they can save water instead.
- 3. Give students the worksheets (may be individual or small group). Students can color and cut out the activity cards.
- 4. Have the students glue the cards into their appropriate category.
- 5. Discuss the answers with students. Ask the students why they think it's important to keep water clean (answers may include: clean water to drink, clean water to play/bathe in, etc.) Briefly explain to students that there are people who work at water districts (Hallsdale-Powell being one) around the clock to ensure their water stays clean!

### **Extension**

Have students write or draw one example of their own where water is wasted, but can be saved.
